I have been involved with a number of service projects
over the last few weeks.



It started at Kingswinford and Stourbridge Charter Night. The guest speaker was David Baxter Smith who is the Surgeon who works with the Graham Fulton Trust that provides Prostate Cancer screening. The club had

arranged a very successful session, with over 400 men being tested.

As Beryl placed an order for plants that night, the only way that they could be collected was if we went to the Collection point and helped in the process.



What an operation - over 90 Lions and helpers from Burntwood, Walsall and Kingswinford and Stourbridge moving £20,000 worth of plants which had been delivered overnight from a nursery in Cheshire.



It involved stocking the picking tables, pickers, checkers, wrappers, parcelers, van loaders and drivers.

It was logistics at its best, taking just over four hours to stock all the vans.

Of course the drivers and their assistants then had to make the deliveries, which did not finish until the evening.


