International Convention this year has taken place earlier than normal this year, so instead of starting 'as you read this Jackie and I will be attending International Convention' mine starts 'as you read this, Jackie and I are desperately trying to overcome jet lag as we have just arrived back into Birmingham airport after our eighteen hour journey back from the far east'.

As I'm sure you all realise, this newsletter is being written in advance of us leaving for the International Convention in Busan, South Korea and so we will share the photographs of Convention with you in the August edition of my Newsletter. The plans for our journey start on 13th June when we fly to Seoul, the capital of Korea, via Dubai for a few days of sightseeing and acclimatisation with the other District Governors Elect and their wives. Then it is onward by coach to Busan on Sunday 17th to begin a week of training at the District Governor Elect Seminars.

Convention begins on Saturday 23rd June with the parade, which should be a wonderful event, and we will do our best to fly the flag for Multiple District 105. Convention finishes on Tuesday 26th June when I am one of seven hundred and fifty Lions sworn in as District Governor 2012-2013. The final leg of our trip is to fly to Hong Kong for a further four days and then it is the long haul flight home, again via Dubai, arriving in Birmingham, blurry eyed, at noon on Sunday 1st July.

Then the work as District Governor starts! District Handover is at St John's Hotel in Solihull on Sunday 15th July and I have my first proper Council Meeting from 27th to 29th July. As I am writing this, we are in the process of arranging the first three months of club visits which I intend to begin in August. It will be a very busy year but one, I hope, we will all enjoy together.

CHALLENGE

District Governor's Wife's Appeal – Teenage Cancer Trust



It is the custom for the wife or partner of every District Governor to support a charity for their year. My charity this year is in aid of the Teenage Cancer Trust, which is dear to my heart.

I was introduced to the charity through a young Lion in my previous club in Bedford, whose brother died of cancer but, during his illness, had been supported by the Teenage Cancer Trust.

Cancer is a disease we mainly associate with adults but it attacks all ages and is especially aggressive in teenagers where their natural growth and hormonal changes exacerbates the situation.

The teenage years are difficult enough for most young people as they struggle with all the bodily changes that lead to adulthood, let alone have to face a life-threatening illness. Unfortunately, most hospitals are not set up to cater for the particular needs of these cancer patients. It is probable that, until the age of 16, they will be treated in paediatric wards alongside toddlers, and above 16 they will end up in an adult ward alongside the elderly. In either case, teenagers end up alongside people they do not relate to.

The Teenage Cancer Trust's aim is to build units within NHS hospitals specifically for teenagers with cancer. These units are equipped with the medical facilities to treat cancer but, more importantly, provide the facilities such as day rooms and kitchens for them to relax in and feel at home and also provide them with familiar things such as computers, TVs and play stations in order to occupy their time whilst they are being treated.

Most importantly, the units provide an environment where teenagers can meet others in a similar situation and allow patients to build friendships and mechanisms to cope with their disease. The Teenage Cancer Trust also funds Activities Coordinators in some units, to help patients cope with their disease and pass the time in hospital.

Teenage Cancer Trust run Family Support Networks which provide support, in an informal setting to young people and their families, siblings and partners during and after the young person's cancer treatment. The networks focus on the needs of the whole family; if loved ones are supported, the young person in turn will be supported. They also fund research into why young people get cancer and how best to treat it, ultimately improving diagnosis, treatment and survival rates.
