



A huge thank you for the magnificent way in which the Lions of 105M, and the rest of the MD, have responded to the disaster in the Philippines.

Within days of the disaster clubs in the district were mobilising themselves to organise events and collections.



What your money is paying for

As you will know, the MD has pledged £200,000 to pay for 1,000 Lifesaver water bottles to be sent to the Philippines. These will provide over 20,000,000 litres of clean disease free water.

To put it another way, that's the equivalent of providing the town I live in, Castle Bromwich, with enough water to drink and cook with for a year.

An unprecedented loan of \$50,000 from LCIF has kicked off the appeal and, at the time of writing, this District had raised over £13,000, not including the Birmingham Chinatown event or other collections I am aware of.

Well done. It's what makes Lions great!
